Bids for Fall Coronation are due to Kingdom June 1st so should be received by Medb at exchequer@ardanroe.org by April 30th for discussion at May's Populace Meeting. TOWN FAIRE

The March Populace Meeting was cancelled, as Gulf Wars XVII was occurring the same week. The Open Gathering/Fiber Arts Night, March 19th was a no-go as those attending Gulf Wars recovered from their week of camping at Kings Arrow Ranch. The Shire's A&S Workshop was held on Wednesday, March 26th at Auld's Library from seven to nine o'clock. Ten adults and one child (Hesperis, Ibrahim, Timo, Apollonia, Sarah, Melisant, Ceara, Michael, Rory, Medb, and Alexi) attended. Melisant of Exmoor taught a class on how to sew gussets and gores into tunics. Everyone was encouraged to bring fabric and sewing machines. Ibrahim was able to leave with a tunic cut out and partially sewn. Sarah learned a new way to create a tunic's neck. Apollonia worked on an embroidery project while Ceara got feedback for designing a dress out of really fancy fabric. Rory and Hesperis worked on her name and device submission. Shire business, including reimbursements and transferring of office files, was also conducted. Ideas for future A&S Workshops were also discussed.

Fighter practice was held at ten o'clock Saturday, March 22nd at the Mike Woods Park in Bossier City. At least two fighters, Johannes and Lorccan, attended.

HERALDIC RESULTS

For the November 2007 meetings, printed March 19, 2008:

Registered:

GLEANN ABHANN

Ceara inghean uí Bhárdáin. Name and device. Per chevron embattled argent and azure, three four-leaved clovers slipped one and two azure and a panpipe Or.

Submitted as *Ceara Ó Bárdáin*, the submitter combined a feminine Gaelic given name with a masculine patronymic marker. In Gaelic, if a patronymic marker appears directly after a name, the marker must match the gender of that name. Such markers indicate the gender of the person bearing the name. For a name such as *Ó Bárdáin*, when a feminine patronymic marker is inserted in front of the patronymic, the second marker is put into the genitive case. In addition, the first letter of the patronym needs to be lenited. We have changed the name to *Ceara inghean uí Bhárdáin* to correct the grammar.

The submitter indicated that she desired a name meaning "bard" or "from the family of bards". Woulfe, *Irish Names and Surnames*, s.n. Ó Bárdáin, notes that the name etymology of the name gives it the meaning "descendant of the little bard." However, in everyday speech, this patronymic would be taken to mean simply "descendant of the Bardain family". If the submitter is interested in a similar descriptive byname, we suggest *an Dana*, "of the poetry". Mari Elspeth nic Bryan, "Index to Names in Irish Annals", (<http://www.medievalscotland.org/kmo/AnnalsIndex/>) dates this descriptive byname to 1583 and 1589.

A panpipe is palewise by default, but there is not a CD (or even a blazonable difference) for whether the long pipe is on the dexter or sinister side. A check of the currently registered panpipes shows the long pipe on either side, with roughly equal frequency.

James in le Breres. Device. Vert, three bees in pall inverted, heads to center, and on a bordure argent a briar vine sable.

Paul the Small. Device. Azure, a crescent and a chief potency argent.

This device is clear of the device for Eric van Roosebeke, *Sable, a crescent and a chief embattled argent*. There is a CD for changing the field tincture, and as Laurel has previously ruled (03/2000), a second CD for the difference between embattled and potency.

Uther Siemer. Name and device. Sable, an alerion between three eagle's jambes erased a la guise, a bordure embattled Or.

Submitted as *Uther Ziemer*, the byname was an undated header form in Bahlow/Gentry, *German Names*. No documentation was submitted to demonstrate that the *z* --> *s* spelling was found in period (if such a pattern were demonstrated, the spelling *Zierner* would be registerable, but without it, we must treat it as a strictly modern form). We have changed the name to *Uther Sierner* in order to register it. This name combines English and German; this is one step from period practice.

The submitter has a letter of permission to conflict with the name *Luther Zeimer*, registered August 2002.

The submitter indicated that he was most interested in sound. However, if he is interested in a Z form of the name with a different vowel sound, we suggest *Zeimer*. Monasterium (www.monasterium.net) has a photograph of a documented from Windberg dated to 1473; the description shows the name *Conrad Zeimer*. An examination of the document shows, as near as we can tell, an abbreviated form of the name -- *Zeim [with a tail]*. It is clear, though, that the first letter in the name is a Z.

As Batonvert notes:

As for the alerion or allerion, originally the charges in the arms of Lorraine appear to have been eagles: they were shown with beaks and/or feet until the end of the 13th C. (Pastoureau's *Traité d'Héraldique*, p.150). However, de Bara's *Blason des Armoiries*, 1581, p.213, shows the arms of Lorraine with beakless footless birds, and explicitly blazons them *Allerions*. They get no difference from eagles, but it does look like they'd become blazonable artistic variants by the end of our period.

We would add that the alerion may *only* be displayed: both because the period evidence supports no other posture, and because the lack of beak and feet make this posture essential for recognizability.

November 2007 – Returned

GLEANN ABHANN

Keyna Aherne. Device. Per saltire vert and Or, a horse passant sable.

This device is returned for conflict with the device for Melinda Cheval du Feu, *Per fess rayonny argent and sable, in chief a horse courant sable*. There is one CD for changes to the field but nothing for changing the horse's posture. As Melinda's horse is forced to be in chief, there is not a CD for placement of the horse.



Over the Fence



Melisant of Exmoor was born in the year of our Lord, 1345 near Devon, which is located in southwest England. Her father, Harald the Carter, was a carter who worked in and around Devon. He also was known as having a special way with horses. People would bring their horses to him for training, mainly for fixing behavior problems (which were actually caused by poor handling), and for problems with their horse's health.

When Melisant was around 5 years old, her mother died of the plague. Her father raised her by himself and would take her with him when he worked. Since he had no other children, he doted on Melisant and taught her everything he knew about horses. She grew to love them as much as he did and seemed to have inherited his "gift" with horses. She learned to ride and drive horses at an early age and became very helpful to him in his work. She would often dress as a boy since dresses got in the way of riding.

Around the year of our Lord, 1350, King Edward III declared a section of land between Devon and Summerset to be The Royal Forest of Exmoor. This land had an indigenous breed of ponies running on it in semi-wild herds. These ponies were known as Exmoor ponies and had been in the region since the dawn of time. They were all small, but very strong, capable of carrying adults. They were all brown or bay in color with oatmeal colored areas on their muzzles and around their eyes. They also had an extra set of molars that were found in no other horse breed.

The King wanted the unique ponies protected and also wanted to use the forest as hunting lands for himself and his nobles.

Although trees were not numerous in Exmoor, since it was indeed a moor, it was called a forest nonetheless. The term "forest" was used for all hunting lands, whether they had trees or not. The King wanted to appoint a forester who was also good with horses to look after The Royal Forest of Exmoor. He was told of Harald the Carter's good reputation, so he appointed him as Royal Forester in 1355. The King gave Harald a section of land in Exmoor and had a house built for him and his young daughter who was ten years old.

Melisant grew up on the moor and continued to help her father with his work. She loved the Exmoor ponies and developed special bonds with several of them. She could often be found flying across the moor, bareback and bridleless, on one of her pony friends. She would guide them with subtle cues from her feet, legs and seat and voice cues. People from nearby towns and villages would continue to bring their problem horses to them for "fixing".

When the King and his nobles and guests came to hunt, Melisant and her father would act as guides to the hunting parties. Since they were both Christians, Harald and Melisant would attend church on Sundays.

Melisant was also taught to read and write by her father, who was literate. He had been taught by his mother who had spent some time in a convent before she married. Melisant and her father were considered middle-class. They also raised a few sheep, cows, and geese and had a small plot of crops. Melisant was taught to do “womanly” things like sewing, and spinning and weaving from a kindly neighbor. She always preferred to be outside working with the animals, though. Her father taught her how to cook and hunt with a long bow.

When Melisant was around twenty or so, she met a young man who was in one of the King’s hunting parties. He was Olaf Lutherson from the island of Oland (pronounced Erlund). He was visiting his relative, one of the King’s nobles. Olaf was riding a kind of horse Melisant had never seen before. It was yellow in color with a white mane and tail. There was a black stripe that ran from the horse’s forelock, through its mane, down its back and through its tail. The mane was cut short in a crescent shape so it would stand up. The white hairs were cut shorter than the black hairs. This gave the mane a very unique look. The horse also had stripes on its knees and hocks. It was small, but very stocky in build. Melisant asked Olaf about his unusual horse and learned that he had gotten it from a trading expedition to Norway. It was called a Norwegian Fjord. She told Olaf all about the Exmoor ponies. The two were attracted to each other from the start. Because of her, Olaf decided to stay with his relative in England.

After a suitable courtship period, Olaf asked for Melisant’s hand in marriage. Harald gave them his blessing and the two were wed. Olaf had a house built for them on the moor, not too far from Harald, with the King’s permission. He and Melisant continued to help Harald with his forestry and horse training. When Harald passed away, Olaf became the Royal Forester of Exmoor.

Olaf and Melisant were blessed with two children, a boy they named Eric Olafson and a girl they named Elizabeth. Melisant would still don a pair of breeches on occasion (when no one was around to see) and ride across the moors. People in the region would still bring their horses to the couple for training and doctoring. Melisant actually did the work at first, but let Olaf take the credit for it, since it was not traditional “women’s work”. She taught Olaf her method of horse training and he became as proficient as she. And they all lived happily ever after (most of the time).



CARRIAGE CHATTER

Gulf Wars XVII, March 9-16, Kingdom of Gleann Abhann

While there was the possibility of snow, Gulf Wars XVII was cold and wet but not snowy during the first half and comfortably dry and cool during the second half of the week-long inter-kingdom event. Drogo of Axbridge became the sixth Knight of Gleann Abhann on Saturday, March 15th following vigil that day and Great Court that night. Others recognized by the Crown of Gleann Abhann included Bethany Bacon and Ariadne de Ravenna with the Order of the Diamond Chalice, James in le Breres and Finian O’Niall with the Order of the Onyx Chalice, Ceara O’Bardain with the Order of the Shepherds, and Sabine le Curter with Citizen of Gleann Abhann. Sarah MacGregor ended her term as Obsidian Herald turning the office over to Finian O’Niall. Finian becomes the second person to hold the office at the Kingdom level. Medb ingen ui Mael Anfaid completed her term as Troll for Gulf Wars, while Sarah ended her term as War Herald for Gulf Wars. Sabine served as weekend Watch Commander from six o’clock Friday morning to the close of War. Olaf Lutherson of Oland and Melisant of Exmoor fought in every battle, Melisant at times as a combat archer. Apollonia and Timo were also present. Apollonia took the smocking classes during the week. And Blaec le Dering served as entourage to TRH William and Onora and fought in many battles. In addition to Sarah, Sabine, Medb, James, Olaf, Melisant, Timo, Apollonia, and Blaec attending all or most of the war week, Michael atte Harp, Ceara and her parents were present during Saturday. Ceara was given the honor of leading the Gleann Abhann Army to the field behind TRM Uther and Kenna. She also served as a water bearer during the battles. Big thanks go to Rebecka MacGillivray for the ram bandanna project which fitted every (or nearly every) head in the army with a bandanna.
